## P1 Supporters Group

Would you like to be part of a P1 Hockey Supporters Group to raise funds for a P1 Coaching Fund? Many of you enjoy watching P1 Mens hockey, and this is a way for individuals to channel their enthusiasm in a way that directly assists the team. With limited funds, WISC is not always able to pay for a coach, and while we can seek grants for coaching costs, this is not always successful. This is where you can be part of the solution.
